Back to Business!



With the slow rollout of COVID-19 vaccines worldwide, there is cautious optimism that the international sports calendar can return to some sort of new normal; which means for World Para Taekwondo – it's back to business!

Highlighted by the two biggest events in Para Taekwondo history – the sport's introduction to the **Paralympic Games** in September and the biggest **World Championships** yet in October – the Para Taekwondo calendar is falling into place.

The first order of business is to determine which athletes from Europe and Asia will claim the remaining Paralympic spots. The all-or-nothing **Paralympic Qualification tournaments** are set for 9 May in Sofia, Bulgaria (Europe) and 16 May in Amman, Jordan (Asia).

Keeping in mind that the ongoing pandemic could still play havoc on the holding of international sporting events, Para Taekwondo's **Continental Open championships** are also set to return in 2021, offering athletes the first chance to collect rankings points for the 2024 Paralympic Games in Paris, France.

Currently, three such tournaments are scheduled. The European and Pan Am Open events have yet to be confirmed.

- African Open Championships May 29-30 Niamey, Niger
- Asian Open Championships June 15 Beirut, Lebanon
- Oceania Open Championships November 19 Papeepe, French Polynesia

There are other major events in 2021 to take note of as well, including the return of the President's Cup (Asia) on 17 June in Nablus, Palestine, and the introduction of Para Taekwondo to the Asian Youth Para

Games, held in Bahrain from December 1-10. Other events could still be added.

In preparation for Para Taekwondo's "return to play", athletes, coaches, classifiers, referees, and administrators are encouraged to make sure that they are registered, classified, and have up-to-date trainings and certifications. For more on how to do this, see the sections below.

So, while it may take some time before things return to 'business as usual', at least athletes and coaches can get back to the business of training and competing. We can't wait to see you again soon!

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Based on our best estimates, World Para Taekwondo believes that there are now over 2,200 Para Taekwondo practitioners worldwide. Yet only 900 are registered in the Global Membership System (GMS).

To help you get your athletes going ahead of WPT's return to international competitions, here's a handy guide on how to get your athletes registered with the new World Taekwondo Classification System (WTCS).

Step One - Register

- Designate only one person from your MNA to work with the WTCS.
- Have that person fill out the WTCS Account Request Form, found here: https://db.ipc-services.org/wtcs/app/login.
- Email the completed WTCS Account Request Form topara-tkd@worldtaekwondo.org.
- A username and password will be emailed to your MNA's contact person.

Step Two - Apply

- All forms must be filled out electronically (no handwriting except date / signatures), and in English.
- Be sure the athlete has a World Taekwondo License Number (GAL).
- Download the Medical Diagnostic Form (MDF) here: https://1drv.ms/w/s!ArCSmGBuzlK7hboOu8FrxZEg_l9xOg?e=Ly1AoN
- Fill out the MDF Form by collecting all relevant documentation, photos, signatures, etc.
- Upload the MDF Form, photos, and any other necessary documents all in PDF format to your MNA's WTCS Account.
- In the event of an incomplete form, the Head of Classification will contact the MNA with details.

Step Three - Await Decision

 The completed application is then sent to an Evaluation Group who assesses the athlete's eligibility and provides comments to the Head of Classification.

- Either the Evaluation Group or the Head of Classification could ask your MNA for more information on the athlete.
- For all MDF's submitted, The Head of Classification will provide feedback on eligible impairment and whether or not the athlete is believed to meet the Minimum Impairment Criteria (MIC).

Step Four – Train!

- Once your athlete has been accepted, it's time to get ready for international events.

- Be sure to register for all tournaments you plan to attend!
- Train! Train! Train!
- All new athletes will meet with a Classification Panel in-person at their first event. The athlete will then be placed in the appropriate Sport Class based on this evaluation.

We're looking forward to seeing you and your athletes at an international tournament near you in the very near future. Happy training everyone!

Paralympic Playbooks

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Last month, the IPC released a series of "playbooks" outlining the rules that must be followed by athletes, coaches, and Paralympic partners as they travel to Tokyo for the 2020ne Paralympic Games. Developed jointly by the IOC, the IPC, the Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee, and the All-Partners Task Force, which includes the WHO, Government of Japan, and Tokyo municipal government, anyone planning to travel to Japan this summer is encouraged to read these playbooks and contact your Member National Association if you have any questions.

Please note that the Playbooks will be further updated in April, providing more details based on feedback from partners, ongoing discussions, and the current status of the pandemic.

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Asia:

Iranian Athletes Hold Prep Camp in Kish Island

Iran's former world champions Mehdi Pourahnama and Asghar Aziziaghdam are in the lush resort town of Kish

Island as they prepare to take their shots at Paralympic glory this summer. Already in their fifth training camp, the two stars have morning and afternoon sessions from 26 February to 15 March. Aziziaghdam is a two-time world champion, while Pourahnama has four world titles and is a favourite to win gold in Tokyo.

Lisa Gjessing Named Denmark's #1 Paralympic Medal Hope

The Danish Broadcasting Corporation named fourtime world champion and No. 1-ranked Lisa Gjessing as Denmark's top medal prospect at this summer's Paralympic Games. Gjessing headed up a list that also includes Peter Rosenmeier (table tennis), Kristel Walther and Daniel Wagner (athletics), and Amalie Vinther (swimming).

"For the Paralympics, I am especially looking forward to feeling the atmosphere that the whole world unites around one thing – namely sports", Gjessing told the news agency.

Finland Taekwondo Federation President talks WT Trainings in Feature Article

The Finland Taekwondo Federation featured interviews with Finland Taekwondo Federation President Kari Sirviö, an experienced international referee that is shortlisted to officiate at Para Taekwondo's debut at the 2020ne Paralympic Games, and Chakir Chelbat, the Para Taekwondo Committee Chair in its March issue. The 1200-word feature highlights the history of Para Taekwondo, World Taekwondo's new training programmes, and Finland's participation in the sport, including Paralympic-hopeful and world championship medalist Matti Sairanen. Sirviö, who refereed at the Tokyo 2020 Test Event and the African Paralympic Qualification tournament, recently completed Levels I and II of the coaches' training. Chelbat hopes to see more Finnish clubs participate in the future:

"Knowledge is power", he told the Finnish Taekwondo Federation. "Study increases awareness in clubs."

Pan Am:

Government of Peru Supports Pan Am Champ Espinosa Carranza

The Government of Peru recently spotlighted Angelica (Leonor) Espinosa Carranza, the lone fighter from the country to qualify for the 202One Paralympic Games. Espinosa Carranza became a legend at home by winning Pan Am gold after being named the country's



flagbearer when Peru hosted Para Taekwondo's debut at the 2019 Pan Am Games. The Peruvian government noted its support for the fighter through the Athlete Support Programme and the Let's Go with Tokyo programme of the Peruvian Institute of Sports. In addition to attending three tournaments ahead of the Paralympic Games, Espinosa Carranza will also attend training camps in Brazil and Mexico.

"The idea is to participate in all [the tournaments] because they would be before the Paralympic Games and this would [help] me in the ranking and [show] how I am in competitions after so many months [off]", Espinosa Carranza explained.
